The Nursery and Primary school's sustainability team under the Eco Label program created awareness raising activities among students, teachers, and parents about mobility, noise pollution, gardening, waste management and biodiversity. Through Erasmus programs and educational trips, the entire student community learned how to protect the natural environment.

• The sustainability team promotes a new generation of students who are involved with protecting the ecosystem. The first Eco Committee group of 4th and 5th grade students was formed. It's members actively participated in school committees related to the environment and helped to create the school agenda of this year and set the first "Eco rules" for all primary school students.

Collaboration with organizations such as Bruxelles Capitale, Bruxellles Mobilité, Pro Vélo, to
promote the concept of mobility. Organization of activities for both teachers and students as
well as parents to encourage mobility on foot and by bicycle whenever possible. At the same
time, bicycle parking spaces were increased within the school premises.

• The use of the garden as a learning tool so that students can get to know the life cycle of plants and vegetables, understand the usefulness of insects and follow the basic rules of proper nutrition.



- The school promotes the zero-waste culture. It suggests to the parents to organize healthy snacks which generate less waste like fruits, vegetables, homade cookies and encourages the use of reusable packaging, metal flask of water and the fair trade of the second-hand book.
- Raising awareness among students through programs and games so that they place trash in the appropriate bins through increasing the placement of bins.
- Participation in a cell phone collection and batteries activity organized by "Safe the Planet".



Waste management

- The school is planning actions to reduce noise pollution and make pupils aware of the benefits of a more quiet learning environment.
- Participation in an Erasmus program through a project with the title: ENIEDE: a pioneering project to sensitize students to environmental protection. This European program gathers classes from Romania, Greece, France and Belgium in an organization called "Un village". The objective is making the students actors of the protection of the environment. Thanks to this project, the students discovered the unsuspected richness of the Brussels fauna, outside the class.
